July means fun and family in StillWaters. Many families make their way to our community around the fourth of July. It is a great time to be on the lake and enjoying all StillWaters has to offer. Please be careful driving in our community. More people will be out walking, running, biking, and just enjoying StillWaters.

Pineview Pool, located adjacent to the SWRA Centre, is a great place to cool off on a hot July day. The pool renovations have been completed. Eligible owners can access the pool by using their electronic gate card. The electronic gate card also allows access to the tennis/pickleball courts. Please contact the SWRA office if you do not have one of the new electronic gate cards.

Fireworks are always a favorite on July 4th but remember fireworks are not allowed in StillWaters. The Lake Martin Amphitheater located at 8878 Kowaliga Road, Eclectic, AL 36024, aka The AMP, starts its July 4th program at 5:45pm with fireworks around 9pm. You can go by car or boat to enjoy the fireworks. For those who have access to a boat, just ride around the Blue Creek area of Lake Martin and you will see plenty of fireworks.

The Tallapoosa Sheriff's department will be on patrol at StillWaters beginning July 3rd through July 7th. They will write tickets for traffic violations and help maintain control of people who are in violation of rules. You may see a patrol car parked at different locations throughout the community, should you have a need please approach them and ask for assistance.

Parking is always an issue during the July 4th holiday. Please remember trailers, boats, and vehicles cannot be parked on the side of a road. Trailers parked on the side of a road or any other common area may be booted and the owner will pay a fine to have the boot removed. Owners can park extra vehicles in designated parking lots at the Welcome Centre or SWRA Centre.

Remember to register your golf cart or utility vehicle with SWRA. All golf carts and utility vehicles must comply with SWRA policy which requires brake lights, turn signal lights, tail lights, and headlights. A window decal is required to be displayed on the front windshield of all golf carts and utility vehicles. Those not displaying a StillWaters window decal may be removed from common property.

Take a walk around our community, play a round of golf at StillWaters Golf Club, take a dip in the pool, check out the live music at Copper's Grill and enjoy the July 4th holiday. Take a break from everyday worries, they will still be there after your time off. I hope everyone has a great July 4th and rest of the summer.



Skin Cancer Awareness for Lake Living

Skin cancer is the most common form of cancer in the US, and the number of cases has increased over the past few decades. Even with growing awareness, many are not taking action to protect themselves. The American Cancer Society (ACS) estimates that 5.4 million skin cancers are diagnosed each year. Most cases come from too much sun exposure, but many also come from man-made sources such as tanning beds or sun lamps. While everyone is potentially at risk for developing skin cancer, numerous factors increase risk, including...

- Chronic ultraviolet (UV) light exposure
- Having fair skin
- Having multiple or atypical moles
- Advanced age
- Gender, males are more at risk
- Previous skin cancer
- Long-term or severe skin inflammation or injury
- Psoriasis treatment



- Society views tanned skin as attractive
- Some believe a "baseline sunburn" is needed for a sun tan
- People only think of using sunscreen while on the beach or lake and not while engaging in other outdoor activities (for example: yard work, playing sports, picnicking)
- People overlook skin protection options other than sunscreen (such as hats, caps, long sleeves)
- People only use sunscreen as a response to a burn rather than initial prevention

It is important to check your skin regularly for abnormal changes. Be aware of your normal pattern of moles, freckles, and blemishes. If you have a history of previous skin cancer, it is recommended that you have a doctor examine your skin regularly, perhaps as often as 1 to 2 timers per year.

Garbage Can Violations

The pick up day for garbage cans in StillWaters is every Wednesday. This poses a problem for part-time owners who are usually in StillWaters only on the weekends. No one wants to leave their garbage can full of smelly trash. Also, owners can incur a \$25 fine per occurrence for placing their garbage can out too early and leaving it out too long after pickup.

The StillWaters covenants do not allow owners to leave their garbage cans by the side of the road for more than a day. SWRA offers a "roll out-roll back' garbage can program. For only \$125 per year, SWRA will roll your garbage can to the road side the day before garbage pickup and will roll your garbage can back to your house on Wednesday after the can has been emptied.

Tennis and Pickleball Court Etiquette

Last year pickleball court lines were added to the tennis courts to make the courts multi-user courts for both sports. Pickleball is continuing to increase in popularity while tennis seems to remain about the same in our community. StillWaters only has two courts for both sports to use and at times the higher number of pickleball players can conflict with tennis court users.

SWRA does not have a schedule as to when each group can use the courts and a schedule is not always the best answer. SWRA prefers owners to use the courts as much as possible but not dominate the courts with either sport. The best solution is for tennis and pickleball players to work together and understand the courts must be shared by everyone.

Next time you are at the court playing your favorite sport make sure you give others the opportunity to use the courts also. Allowing someone to show up early and hold the courts until the group arrives or placing "court reserved" signs on the entrance gate is not permissible. The courts are available on a first-come, first-served basis but everyone needs to limit their time to a few games per day when others are waiting to use the courts.

Honey Bees in StillWaters

There have been a couple of recent reports of honey bee swarms found in StillWaters. Honey bee swarms are common but not dangerous. The sound and number of bees can be disturbing to some people. Please do not apply insecticide to a honey bee swarm. We need these endangered bees to keep our environment healthy.

Swarming is a natural process in the life of a honey bee colony. Swarming occurs when a large group of honey bees leave an established colony and fly off to establish a new colony, essentially creating two from one. Swarming is a natural method of propagation that occurs in response to crowding within the colony. Swarming usually occurs in late spring and early summer and begins in the warmer hours of the

Honey bee swarms may contain several hundred to several thousand worker bees, a few drones, and one queen. Swarming bees fly around briefly and then cluster on a tree limb, shrub, or other object. Clusters usually remain stationary for an hour to a few days, depending on the weather and the time needed to find a new nest site by scouting bees. When a suitable location for the new colony, such as a hollow tree, is found the cluster breaks up and flies to it.

Honey bee swarms are not highly dangerous under most circumstances. Swarming honey bees feed prior to swarming, reducing their ability to sting. Further, bees away from the vicinity of their nest (offspring and food stores) are less defensive and are unlikely to sting unless provoked.

In most situations when a honey bee swarm is found on a tree, shrub or house you do not need to do anything. Swarms are temporary and the bees will move on if you patiently ignore them. Stay back and keep others away from the swarm, but feel free to admire and appreciate the bees from a safe distance.

SWRA Fireworks Policy

The StillWaters Residential Association (SWRA) Board recognizes the need to maintain the peace, tranquility, and safety of the community. The Board further recognizes the need to follow state of Alabama code regarding the use, sale, and distribution of fireworks.

Fireworks Policy

The SWRA Board adopts a policy to prohibit the use, sale, or distribution of fireworks within the StillWaters community with actions identified when policy is violated.

SWRA Board of Directors Resolution (June 28, 2016)

Code of the State of Alabama - Section 8-17-222

- It shall be unlawful to offer for sale or to sell any fireworks to children under the age of 16 years unless accompanied by an adult or to any intoxicated or irresponsible person.
- Any person purchasing fireworks shall be required to show a valid driver's license or state approved identification card.
- It shall be unlawful to explode or ignite fireworks within 600 feet of any church, hospital, asylum, public school, any enclosed building, or within 200 feet of where fireworks are stored, sold, or offered for sale.
- No person shall ignite or discharge any permissible articles of fireworks within or throw the same from a motor vehicle while within, nor shall any person place or throw any ignited article of fireworks into or at such a motor vehicle, or at or near any person or group of people.

 (Acts 1981, No. 81-409, p. 638, §13; Acts 1987, No. 87-563, p. 876, §6.)

Policy Enforcement

The SWRA Board wishes this policy to be a self-enforcement policy, as much as possible, by the owners and visitors of StillWaters. The Board asks that owners make a sincere effort to adhere to this policy.

In an effort for the Board to act responsibly to look out for the safety and well-being of its owners and visitors, violators or those witnessed to be acting in a manner contrary to this policy will be notified. Owners as well may notify the SWRA staff of any witnessed violations. Violators will be reminded of the policy and asked to adhere to the policy immediately. A notice will be filed with the SWRA for review.

Violations of Policy:

- Use of fireworks within the StillWaters community
- Sale or distribution of fireworks within the StillWaters community

Violation of Policy Protocol:

First Violation: A notice will be placed in the property owner's file for future reference and a written "Advisory Notice" will be mailed to the registered owner.

Second Violation: A "certified" letter from the SWRA Board will advise the property owner of its multiple violations of policy and ask the owner to strictly adhere to the policy or expect to be assessed a fine of \$500.00 for each additional incident.

Third Violation: A letter from the SWRA Board will advise the property owner of its multiple violations of policy and assess the owner a \$500.00 fine.

Fourth Violation: The SWRA Board will assess an additional \$500.00 fine for each further violation in cumulative.

Note: Unpaid fines may become a lien again the registered owner's property.




