### From the General Manager - Kevin Eason

All StillWaters property owners should have paid their annual 2020 association fees by February 1<sup>st</sup>. Property owners who do not pay their 2020 association fees on or before close of business on February 14<sup>th</sup> will incur a late charge in the amount of \$125. SWRA offers a monthly payment plan for any property owner that needs a little extra time to pay their fees provided all previous year's fees have been paid. Please contact the SWRA office before February 14<sup>th</sup> to set up a payment plan.

The 2020 SWRA vehicle window decals will be mailed to all property owners who have paid their 2020 annual association fee as of February 5<sup>th</sup>. The decals will be included in the same envelope as the election ballots for the SWRA Board of Directors. Property owners will receive two window decals but can obtain additional decals from the SWRA office. The gate attendants will honor the 2019 window decals until February 29<sup>th</sup>; however, starting March 1<sup>st</sup> all vehicles not displaying the 2020 window decals will be required to stop and give the gate attendant their name and address.

Residents of StillWaters that do not own property or who own property that is not governed by the '71, '74, or '87 covenants may obtain their window decals at the SWRA office by providing proof of residency in StillWaters. Proof of residency can be proven with a utility bill or drivers license in the name of the person obtaining the resident decal indicating an address within StillWaters.

There are three candidates nominated for election to the SWRA Board of Directors for 2020. Their biographies are printed in this newsletter. Property owners in good standing will receive an election ballot in the mail by mid-February. Please make sure you vote and return the ballot to the SWRA office before 5:00 pm, February 28<sup>th</sup>.

Starting immediately people burning yard debris in StillWaters will no longer contact the Still Waters Volunteer Fire and Rescue office for a burn permit. StillWaters residents will now call the SWRA office at 256-825-2990 or email <a href="mailto:kevin@stillwatersra.com">kevin@stillwatersra.com</a> to notify SWRA of their intent to burn yard debris. This is only for people burning debris inside the gates of StillWaters.

Please remember to submit an Architectural Review Committee permit request form for approval before any repair or remodeling work is started. ### SWRA Election Committee

The Election Committee oversees the election for the SWRA Board of Directors. The committee also counts and verifies all ballots received by SWRA. The following people have agreed to serve on the Election Committee.

Sally Gant, Linda Hickey, Mitzy Hidding, Myrna Lehman and Rita McCollister Alternate: Chuck Lehman

Elections Ballots will be mailed to SWRA members and should be returned to the SWRA office addressed to: Secretary, SWRA Board. Ballots must be in the office no later than Friday, February 28, 2020. Ballots that are postmarked by February 28th will be counted as long they arrive before the Election Committee meets. Members must be in good standing in order to vote, which means that all monies due to SWRA must be paid by that date.

### SWRA BYLAWS - ARTICLE VII - NOMINATIONS AND ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Section 7.2 The Board of Directors shall appoint an Elections Committee consisting of five (5) members, in good standing, at least 60 days prior to the election. The Committee's duties include verifying all ballots and proxies and announcing the results to the membership at the annual meeting and by other means. The Nominations Committee may serve as the Elections Committee at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Section 7.3 Elections to the Board of Directors shall be by written ballot. The Secretary shall prepare ballots listing the Board vacancies and those properly nominated to fill them and shall mail ballots to each member at least 14 days prior to the election. The member may cast as many votes as parcels owned for each candidate but may not cumulate those votes for one candidate in elections with more than one vacancy. The ballot must be signed by the member or proxy and returned to the Elections Committee for verification. The Elections Committee will verify all votes including those made by proxy and comparing the number of votes to the number of parcels owned. All Ballots will be held by the Committee as confidential. The Elections Committee may disallow all ballots not received by the due date or improperly executed by the member or proxy.

Section 7.4 The Elections Committee will count all proper ballots and publicize the results to the membership at the members' meeting and by such other means deemed appropriate. All ballots will be destroyed unless a recount request is filed with the Elections Committee by at least one third (1/3) of members casting ballots within ten (10) days of the members' meeting.

Along with our business meeting, we are pleased to have Lance LeFleur, Director, Alabama Department of Environmental Management, to inform us on the emergence of poultry production in the Middle Tallapoosa Basin just above the lake and its environmental consequences relative to the water quality of our lake.



Lake Watch president, Eric Reutebuch, will give an overview of results from Lake Watch volunteer water quality monitoring throughout the lake, including an update on our monitoring of streams with significant poultry production above the lake. ### **More Benefits of Vitamin D**

Vitamin D has traditionally been known for its role in bone health. However, a new global study led by Queen Mary University of London found vitamin D supplementation also protects against the development of respiratory infections. Researchers found that vitamin D boosts levels of antimicrobial peptides in the lungs.

How can you ensure your vitamin D levels are adequate? First, start by increasing your intake of vitamin D-rich foods, including tofu, cheese and fatty fish (such as tuna, salmon or mackerel). Numerous other foods are enriched with vitamin D, including dairy products, orange juice and cereals. Your doctor can order a blood test to determine your vitamin D level. If found deficient, your doctor will prescribe a supplementation plan to restore vitamin D levels for overall health.

### **Be Mindful About Melatonin**

Melatonin is a natural hormone that plays an important role in sleep. Melatonin levels increase when exposed to darkness and decrease when exposed to light. As the sun sets each day, melatonin helps you fall asleep. Light, such as blue light from phones and computers, can disrupt this process.

Melatonin is available as a supplement at nearly every pharmacy in forms such as tablets, capsules and gummies. Taking melatonin is generally safe when used short-term. Side effects are minor and include nausea, headache and drowsiness. People often consider melatonin when battling jet lag, insomnia and other sleep-related problems. Melatonin should be taken about one hour before bedtime in these situations.

Melatonin is a nutritional supplement, and not regulated as a drug. Before taking melatonin, talk to your doctor or pharmacist. Melatonin comes in many strengths, and your doctor or pharmacist can help determine a proper dose for you.



### **February Gardening Tips**

- FRUITS AND NUTS Planting season continues for dormant trees. Fertilize fruit trees. Apply half of the fertilizer recommended for grapes now; apply the other half soon after fruit sets. Continue dormant pruning and grafting. Start strawberry plantings.
- SHRUBS Planting season continues. Visit camellia shows to learn of hardy varieties in your area. Graft camellias in Central and South Alabama. Spray all shrubs with a fungicide before new growth starts. Good time to prime all shrubs before new growth starts. Don't prune early-blooming species because flower buds will be removed.
- **ROSES** Prune hybrid tea roses in South Alabama; delay pruning for a few weeks in North Alabama. Continue planting.
- ANNUALS AND PERENNIALS Replant early plantings of hardy annuals. Prepare beds for summer annuals
- **BULBS** Plant cannas, amaryllis, gladiolus, and zephyranthes in South Alabama; delay planting for a few weeks in North Alabama.
